

Indonesian B (HL/SL) 11

Time: 7 x 35 minutes per week

Course Description:

Indonesian B focuses on language acquisition and intercultural understanding. The course is available at both higher level (HL) and standard level (SL). The two levels differ in the depth of syllabus coverage, the study of literature at HL and the level of difficulty and demands of assessment and assessment criteria. The syllabus content is divided into two main sections, the Core and the Options. The study of the core and options at HL and SL, plus two literary works at HL, will enable students to build the necessary skills to reach the assessment objectives of Indonesian B course through the development of their receptive, productive and interactive skills that can be accomplished through a variety of activities in oral and/or written forms.
